5. Move to a drip system: Drip irrigation offers huge savings in water consumption. Perhaps its main advantage is the ability to target irrigation to root level. This not only improves your crops' growth rate but reduces evaporation-related water loss.

6. Use black polyethylene plastic film: Black polyethylene plastic film can be used to control weeds, keep your soil warm, and save water loss by preventing evaporation.

7. Prepare in advance: If anything does come up at night, keep spare parts and tools on hand so you can handle repairs that can't wait until the morning.
